Fight the gravel application at Watersplash Farm, Gaston Bridge Road and stop the 300 HGV gravel lorries coming to and from the roundabout at the end of Green Lane on a daily basis.

After the bus company withdrew their services we have been able to reinstate nearly all the routes within our area. I will be working with the County Council to improve the service and sort out any problems when the contracts come up for renewal later this year.
